Club Judge Overview



Club Judge

- Important asset to his/her club by being certified by Sail Canada to serve on Protest Committees
- Also encouraged to serves on local area sailing protest committees.



Club Judge Requirements

- Belongs to a Sail Canada member club or other club affiliated to an ISAF member national authority
- Is required to submit an application form to their Provincial Sailing Association.
 - This form details the applicant's protest committee experience and formal attendance at seminars, test taken , etc. Two references must also be supplied from any of the following: Commodore, Rear Commodore, Club Fleet Captain, Sail Canada Regional , National judge or ISAF Judge

Alternatively

- Application form details the practical experience and a formal letter from an officer of the applicant's club, confirming that the individual is an active club member and requesting certification for individual



Practical Experience

- Protest Committee experience
 - Sound knowledge of the RRS
 - Preparation and organization for protest hearings
 - Participation on protest hearings
 - Knowledge on the procedure of a protest hearing
- Racing Participation
 - Racing at the club level or higher at least occasionally within the last 4 years
- Race Committee Experience
 - Participation in various duties involved with running a race



Theory Requirement

- Attended rules, judging or race management seminar within the last 4 years
- Achieved a passing grade on any written rules test as approved by the JSC



Reporting

- Should maintain a log of all of their activities during the past 4 years

Certification

- Is for a period of 4 years, ending on December 31st of the fourth year
