

Sail NB Annual Report

This past season has been another busy year for Sail NB. Recovering from all of the Covig protocols has been very challenging. The board, executive Director, coaches and many volunteers at local clubs continue to build our great sport. I am pleased to share with you a few highlights from the past year.

Membership: Despite membership at the clubs holding steady, attendance at the sailing schools increased and , in a few cases, clubs were faced with instructor and boat shortages in the Adult learn to sail programs.

Clinics: NB held their Instructor`s clinic and Coach Boat Safety clinics in June after a year of cancellation. We limited numbers per protocols and were happy to be able to join Ontario with our Fundamental clinic done online.

Junior Circuit Regattas: NB Sail held their regattas at their three largest clubs and were able to select their Canada Games team. We did not send any sailors out of province to regattas. We had great numbers participating locally and hope to build on our junior program.

Able Sail: The Able Sail program started up again after a year of absence. NB sent a participant to the Mobility cup this summer. She did very well. She is our 2.4 sailor for the Canada Games.
