

Tasks and Responsibilities for Sailing Instructor in Little Current, Ontario.

July 4-Aug 12. \$18/hour.

Job Description: Assist with the implementation of the CanSail Levels 1 & 2 program by performing instructor duties for our CanSail summer camps, including teaching sailing skills, by ensuring sailors are provided with an “on water” experience while also supervising “on shore” activities in periods of inclement weather. The Instructor will report directly to the LCYC Commodore for CANSAIL program. Commodore has 50-year experience in competitive sailing and marine industry.

Responsibilities include: Acting as a role model and leader for an effective safety program on land and water, managing risks and being aware of potential safety issues at all times and preparing written reports of any accidents or incidents. The safety of both our students and our instructors is paramount. The Instructor will supervise the Assistant Instructor, also known as the Rigger. The Instructor will perform outreach and recruiting activities during the pre-sailing season at local schools and other locations to inform the community about the LCYC Learn to Sail Program. The Instructor will make timely requests for necessary equipment, supplies, repairs and maintenance. Club members will fulfill such requests. The Instructor will assist as required in the preparation of special sailing or sailing-related events in Little Current such as Canada Day Parade participation. The Instructor will regularly evaluate the sailors, offering constructive feedback and keep written documentation about students’ progress.

Requirements: Friendly, personable reliable and motivated individual with previous experience. Instructor certification through Sail Canada and valid pleasure craft operator’s card. The Instructor will have earned CANSAIL certification (including Coach Boat Safety), be able to operate a 13-foot inflatable with 15 hp outboard around children, Standard First Aid and VHF radio operators certificate. The Instructor will undergo a Police Background Check (Vulnerable Sector Screening). The Instructor comply with all Codes of Conduct as provided by CANSAIL and must respect individual human rights in Canada including the values underlying the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms as well as other rights. The Instructor is required to use French in day-to-day internal operations when greeting the youth, in customer service, in web-based information and in promoting activities related to tourism such as explaining how French-speakers can register for the program. The Instructor is not required to teach lessons in French.

Shift: Monday-Friday, July 4-Aug 12, 2022, for youth sailors, 8:00am-4:00pm, and some evenings for adult learners as necessary.
