QCYC Learn to Sail has been growing since 2021 was a huge success due in part to an Ontario Trillium Foundation Grant. Upgrades included a new dock system to enhance the quality, safety and consistency of our program and expanding our fleet of Pico and C420 dinghies to include Optimists and RS Zests. The Zests are a great transition boat for the CANSail 2s and 3s. They have all of the same features as a C420 but are a bit easier to manage for smaller sailors.

- Available to work mornings, evenings, weekends, and holidays as required

Job Overview

- Part time June through September – weeknight evenings (typically Mondays and Wednesdays) and/or weekends
- Must be extremely motivated and have enthusiastic energy, creativity, strong leadership skills and unique ideas about teaching sailing
- Full commitment to upholding a high standard of coaching and customer service
- Teach and evaluate appropriate CANSail level developing sailors so they can proceed to the next level
- Work with other instructors to ensure the smooth overall operation of the programs
- Reporting to Head Instructor and Program Director
- Ensure all policies and protocols, especially health and safety protocols, are followed at all times
- Other duties as may be reasonably assigned, including assisting other instructors to teach specific levels, as necessary
