#### **Job Description**

Reporting to the Director of Sailing, the Head High Performance Coach will have a deep level of sailing knowledge, be comfortable coaching sailors as they begin their sailing careers, and be equipped to propel our athletes to challenge for youth titles on the international competition circuit.

The Head Coach will be responsible for overseeing all our team's development and racing programs, leading the coaching staff from a technical standpoint, and delivering on-water coaching to one group of athletes four days per week during the summer, spring, and fall. For each racing group plans must be developed seasonally and daily. There a requirement to attend and coach at local, provincial, national, and international regattas.

The role will require regular contact with parents, other teams, provincial and national sailing associations, regatta coordinators, contractors, and suppliers; and therefore, must be friendly, courteous, and knowledgeable of the rules and regulations. Among the most important qualities we look for in our staff is the ability to instill a love and joy for sailing in those you are teaching and coaching with a positive and encouraging demeanour in order to introduce sailing as a lifelong sport.
