



## Sailing School Instructor for Mobile Sailing School

The Saskatchewan Sailing Clubs Association (Sask Sailing) serves to promote all forms of sailing within the province of Saskatchewan. We do this through our Mobile Sailing School (MSS) programs, Club Assistance programs and the Provincial Racing Team. Additionally, we provide a link between Saskatchewan sailors and Sail Canada, sailing's national governing body.

**Learn to Sail** - Sask Sailing provides a Mobile Sailing School that travels around the province. Participants are instructed by nationally-certified CANSail coaches, using provided Club 420 and/or RS Feva sailboats, or Optimist Dinghies (ages 7-12).

Sask Sailing is seeking a **Sailing School Instructor** who is responsible for assisting the Head Sailing Instructor with the smooth running of MSS. We are looking for an individual who is highly organized, a good motivator, an excellent communicator and dedicated to providing safe, fun and quality sailing instruction. Our ideal candidate is a good team player and able to collaborate with fellow CANSail 1&2 instructors. If you think you are the right fit for our team, please see information below.

These are the minimum qualifications you will need to have:

- Sail Canada Level 1-2 Instructor Trained and Certified
- Registered instructor in good standing with Sail Canada
- The ability to drive a motorboat with an outboard engine and a Pleasure Craft Operator Card (This is an online course done in one day)
- Current and valid first aid certificate that meets the Sail Canada standard

These are the skills/attributes you will need to have:

- A regular sailor at your current club
- Be able to get around the province without depending on Sask Sailing transport (Often there are times where shared transport is an option but it cannot be solely depended on)
- Be comfortable and self-sufficient camping (usually without access to water or electricity) for the 5-day duration of Mobile Sailing School in various locations around the province

- Higher coaching qualification than Sail Canada Level 1-2 (Level 3-4 or higher)
- The desire to gain higher instructor qualifications.
- The desire to become the Sask Sailing Head Coach of MSS
- An instructing or coaching certificate in any other sport
- Instructor experience
- First Aid: Any national program at the EMERGENCY level
- Driver's license and the ability to pull a trailer
- Boat Rescue Standard

The successful applicant will be required to obtain:

- Respect in Sport certification through Sask Sport (This is an online course done in one evening)
- Police Check

We offer competitive wages that are commensurate with experience. The plan for this position is full-time (35 hours per week) for approximately 10 weeks from mid June to the end of August 2024.
