## **Nature and Scope**

- Teach and evaluate CANSail 5&6 C420 and Laser high performance level sailors
- Coordinate and coach the team at three RHYC regattas, and one away regatta.
- Provided there is sufficient enrollment, coach will provide training for Spring and Fall sessions consisting 2 training days a week 3 hours a session in both May-June and September-October (Subject to Change)
- Provide a safe and fun environment to participants in programs at RHYC
- Communicate the goals of the program to parents and sailors
- Provide meaningful progress reports to sailors and parents
- Responsibly operate and care for inflatable coach boats
- Responsibly tow RHYC team trailers to away events
- Provide basic maintenance and promptly report issues with club C420 sailboats
- Work with and receive support from the RHYC Sail Training Head Instructor, RHYC General manager and VC Sail Training
