Industry / Transport Canada Update
Mandatory Life Jacket Wear Regulation Is (may be) coming

- Consultations have been held in Canada results ... broad support for some regulation
- Many jurisdictions in the US (state level) have regulation
- In Canada the discussion
 - Wear requirement by age (14 or 18?)
 - Limited to vessel size (4 or 6 metres?)
- Expected approach not yet identified



Industry / Transport Canada Update

Pleasure Craft Licencing

- Consultations have been held in Canada ... results ... mixed support
- Expected changes
 - Licence period reduced to 5 years
 - For licencing proposed at \$24, increased with inflation
 - Specified time periods for notifying of licence information changes
 - Method of cancelling licences
- Timing
 - changes to vessel registration system effective April 1, 2024
 - PCL changes date unknown



Industry / Transport Canada Update

Engine Cut Off Switches (ECOS)

- Consultations have been held in Canada
- Those in Support
 - would be beneficial in preventing injuries and fatalities;
 - should be required on all craft (regardless of type/size); and
 - are needed to mitigate the risks associated with high-speed craft.
- Comments / Concerns
 - Should be limited to vessel size (i.e. 6 metres), type and activity
 - Regulation unnecessary, could create safety issues
- Timing
 - Fall 2024 publication of regulatory text
 - Coming into force spring 2025

PO 14

Revised PO to address concerns with electronic charts

- 14. With reference to a global navigation satellite system (GNSS) such as GPS (Navstar), Beidou, Glonass or Galileo:
- a) Explain the basic operation of a GNSS enabled device to determine position;
- b) List factors that affect the accuracy of positions given by a GNSS enabled device;
- c) Identify common GNSS enabled applications for navigation and cautions concerning their usage including specific reference to the benefits and risks related to the use of electronic charts for navigation planning and when underway.
- We plan to release a briefing note on this revised performance objective in the April

Curriculum Planning

- Defines organization of the syllabus / standard for effective training delivery
- Considerations defined course structure session number, length, timing
- Helps to ensure good course structure, pace of training, delivery of standard, evaluation of skills
- Constraints to delivery

Weather

Student characteristics – absorption rate, physical ability, language, study time Class size

• Curriculum plan provides agility to restructure training as needed



Lesson Planning

- Defines organization a lesson in the curriculum
- May be multiple plans describing the lessons in one teaching session

Items typically included in a lesson plan

Objective	Goal
Motivator	Topic Introduction
Organization of the topic	Key Content Components
Communications styles to use	Plan to involve students / promote active learning
Resources needed	Timing of lesson subsections
Links to other material	Important items to review
How to evaluate learning accomplished (questions, exercises, activities)	



<u>Lesson Planning Benefits</u> – Be a far more effective instructor

Make your lessons great and repeatable (quality and consistency)

Before the lesson

Review and update your plan

Spend time thinking about and planning how to cover a topic

Document your approach & the resources needed

Remind yourself how to teach / deliver and confirmation of content

During the lesson use the plan as a guide

manage your timing, seamlessly engage students ensures cover content and focus on the key message guides review & evaluation of student progress and learning

After the lesson, think upon

what worked, what you would change, how to improve update your plan



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Document your approach & the resources needed

Remind yourself / confirm of content

During the lesson - use the plan as a guide

manage your timing, seamlessly motivate and engage students cover intended content, focus on the key messages effective review & evaluation of student progress and learning

Recertification Reviewed

- Certification period first certification 3 years
- Subsequent certifications 5 years
- Everyone must recertify
- Recertification clinics run by PSA, objectives set by Sail Canada
- May be modified by PSA, need Sail Canada agreement



Instructor Levels by Application

- Navigation Instructor levels, Keelboat Race Instructor levels
- Prepare / submit application for the level
- Prove / show that you are ready to run a course, submit the following
 - Student exams to 90%
 - Prepare Curriculum Plan(s)
 - Prepare lesson plans
 - Provide presentation and training support materials



Recertification Objectives

- 1. Renew Colregs knowledge (Notes: online exam, open book, to 100%)
- 2. Coach lesson planning and delivery in the range of training environments
- 3. Provide a forum for update on Industry and Sail Canada
- 4. Build peer groups a forum to connect attending instructors
- 5. Physical competency evaluation (instructors not delivering live-aboard)
- 6. Evaluate & coach sailing skills
