The **420 Race Coach** will work closely with our Lead Performance Race Coach to develop the skills of our racing team, to develop sailors' technical & tactical skills and guide them as they transition from 420 to other sailing pathways. With an extensive calendar of spring, summer and fall training in Toronto, paired with travelling to several events, this is a critical role in our junior programs.

POSITION REQUIREMENTS

- Minimum Current Sail Canada CANSail 5&6 Certification or equivalent experience.
- Current First Aid & CPR (or equivalent) certification.
- Current Pleasure Craft Operator's Card and Boat Safety course.
- Toronto Port Authority Operators Permit (Toronto Harbour Licence.)
- Police Check and Vulnerable Sector Screening if 18+ (we can assist with this.)
- Must be enthusiastic, professional, proactive, and demonstrate a true passion for youth sailing.

POSITION RESPONSIBILITIES

- Ensure the proper upkeep of all equipment used for the CANSail programs and report any issues to the Lead Performance Race Coach in a timely manner.
- Provide regular feedback to students around their performance and areas for improvement.
- Communicate with parents and keep them apprised of a student's progress.
- Ensuring campers safety both on and off water, including making sure the environment is conducive to learning sailing for all campers in your sailing group.
- Managing interpersonal conflict within your group to ensure smooth operation of sailing instruction.
- Practice excellence in leadership and personal conduct at all times.

GENERAL COMMENTS

- This is a seasonal position from May to end of August including a mandatory training week, with possible work in the Fall.
- Work week is typically Monday to Friday (9am to 5pm but timing may change due to programming) with occasional weekends to travel for races. Training in the spring is conducted on the weekends typically 10am-4pm with some Friday evening practises.
- Competitive salary commensurate to experience and qualifications, 21-24\$ per hour.
